To help your child keep track of their belongings, please add your child's name on everything they bring to camp. Please send your child in comfortable clothing that is okay to get dirty.



Week 7: Space August 11th - 15th



## **CAMP PRICING**

By checking the weeks you are registering your child on the front of the enrollment form, you are securing your child's space in Summer Day Camp for the week. This also confirms your responsibility for payment that week, regardless of your child's attendance. Each camper must also be a member of the YMCA of the Greater Tri-Valley at the time of registration through the last week of camp to receive member pricing.

The YMCA accepts County Child Care Assistance for payment towards Summer Day Camp costs. The YMCA must receive a written approval letter from the county prior to your child's enrollment through this program.

For families that do not qualify for County Child Care Assistance, the YMCA provides Financial Assistance through the Changing Lives Financial Assistance Program. The YMCA conducts several fundraising events through the year that make this fund possible.

Awards through the Changing Lives Financial Assistance Program are based on a completed Financial Assistance Application and the household income guidelines. Please visit our website or Welcome Centers for a Financial Assistance application.

All Rome Summer Day Camp participants and children under the age of five must have a recent Immunization Record on file.

#### **PAYMENT METHODS**

The YMCA requires all Summer Day Camp payments to be made through automatic withdrawal from a checking, savings, or credit card. We do not accept in-person weekly payments at the Welcome Centers. The YMCA also reserves the right to charge a \$25 fee for any payments returned due to non-sufficient funds

Camper accounts must be paid in full prior to attending for the week

# YMCA CREDIT / REFUND POLICY

The YMCA of the Greater Tri-Valley does not issue credits or refunds in the event of a child's non-attendance for registered weeks. Payments are nontransferable to a different camper or different weeks of camp.

Credits and/or refunds are only issued under the following circumstances:

- 1. A program is cancelled by the YMCA
- 2. A payment error is made by the YMCA
- 3. A written medical excuse by a medical provider with the specific dates of absence provided.

All requests must be made within 60 days of payment.
